GASSAR President Quarterly BOM Report: October - December 2022

Activities of the Past Quarter:

October 6, 2022: The Battle of King's Mountain, Gastonia, N.C.; South Atlantic District Inperson Presidents Meeting. We voted on which national candidates we would endorse, a few of whom spoke to us in person. I was glad to also be joined in that meeting by our Treasurer Scott Collins in his important role as both Georgia and National Color Guard Commander, along with other members of his Color Guard. Afterwards we ate at an Olive Garden and I was able to pick the brain of our Genealogist General, who sat down with my wife and me.

October 7, 2022: The Battle of King's Mountain. The next morning we made our way to South Carolina, for the mighty King's Mountain itself, to commemorate the decisive battle of the same name, where American forces buttressed by the largely Scotch-Irish "Over Mountain " patriots, surrounded and overwhelmed the British forces that were dug into the mountain. The "high ground" was not the place to be that day!

October 11, 2022:
